## **Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund Reporting**

On December 27, 2020, the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) was signed into law. CRRSAA authorizes \$81.88 billion in support for education, in addition to the \$30.75 billion expeditiously provided through the CARES Act. On January 16, 2021, Ozarks Technical Community College received an additional \$3,975,331 in student aid funding to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students. On January 17, 2021, OTC received \$13,059,477 for additional institutional support. CRRSAA authorizes recipients to make a portion of these institutional funds available for student aid.

Reporting date: September 30, 2021

The total amount of HEERF II funding that the institution will receive from the Department of Education for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students is \$3,975,331.

For the calendar quarter ending September 30, 2021, the total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students utilizing HEERF II funding is \$1,853,560.

The estimated total number of students at the institution eligible to participate in summer 2021 Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students is 2,936. This represents the total number of unique students receiving grants. In some instances, multiple disbursements were issued.

Utilizing HEERF II funds, Ozarks Technical Community College provided emergency grants of \$650 each to 1,585 Title IV eligible Pell students and \$570 each to 1,351 Title IV eligible non-Pell students, enrolled in the summer 2021 term, to be used as needed by the student. Student eligibility was vetted through the college's Financial Aid office. (Students with a FAFSA on file indicating an EFC of 0-5711, were identified as high need.)

On July 20, 2021, the eligible students received an email regarding the July 23<sup>rd</sup> distribution.

Additional grants for critical emergency need as a result of the coronavirus disruption, continue to be awarded through an application process to students who meet eligibility requirements. A total of 230 students have received \$205,409. Awards are made on a first come, first served basis as funding is available.

Allowable emergency needs include:

- Food Insecurity
- Housing
- Tuition/Course Supplies/Technology
- Childcare
- Medical Expenses
- Reduced employment/Unemployed
